SHOW RULES

Riders are required to read these conditions carefully.

During all horse competitions, in all classes, riders must wear AS/NZS 3838 Standard safety helmets. Presentation of both horse and rider must be to the standard of show competition, however ring event riders may compete in non-english attire. Test patterns will be made available on the Show website. www.blackallshow.com.au

Riders may have callers, where applicable.

All competitors, including those in led classes and assisting young riders, must sign a waiver form at the Secretary Office prior to competitions.

All horse owners bringing animals to the showgrounds, including companion horses who may not be entered in competitions, must present a livestock movement form to the Secretary Office.

Ponies, Galloways, and Hacks may be measured at any time, or current EFA Height Certificates viewed, to ensure exhibits are competing in the correct class. Breed or Association Certificates may be viewed at any time, to ensure exhibits are competing in the correct class. Stallions may only be entered after the expressed approval of the Steward.

One Horse - One Rider: rule applies across all classes unless otherwise approved by the Steward.

"Local/Regional" - rider must reside in the Blackall-Tambo Council region. "District" - rider must reside within the Blackall, Tambo, Alpha, Longreach, Winton, Ilfracombe, Barcardine, or Isisford regions.

"Pleasure" - exhibits must be ridden in a plain snaffle

No drug, hormone, or tranquilizer shall be administered to any animal exhibit, except under the direction of a veterinarian who must advise the Steward if in their opinion such treatment is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize, in such case the Steward may exclude that animal from competition. The Steward may, at any time, request a blood, saliva or urine sample from exhibit for testing.

Presentations for each section will occur after all classes have been judged. Regardless of placings, all competitors must attend presentations as a show of sportsmanship for fellow riders, stewards and judges.

Professional photographers may be present during competitions, with approval from the Steward.

Rookie Entrants:

Restricted to riders that have never won an Encouragement, Rookie, Beginner, Novice or Open Stockman's Challenge. Competitors who win a Rookie Challenge will remain eligible to compete in Rookie events for that calendar year only. A Rookie competitor who wins 3 Novice Horse Challenges or an Open Challenge is no longer eligible to compete as a Rookie. Any competitor who wins the Rookie division at the end of the series will no longer be eligible to compete in a Rookie Challenge. (Open to all horses)

Novice Entrants:

Eligible horses are not to have won 3 Novice Challenges or won an Open Challenge. If a horse wins 3 Novice Challenges during that calendar year, they will remain eligible to compete in Novice events for that calendar year only. A Novice horse who wins an Open Challenge is no longer eligible to compete as a Novice. Any horse who wins the Novice division at the end of the series will no longer be eligible to compete in a Novice Challenge. (Open to all riders)

If a competitor withdraws less than 168 hours (7 days prior to 7:00am on the first morning of the program), then the entire nomination fee may be retained by the committee. 5. Livestock must be delivered to the grounds between 6:00am - 8:00am Saturday, to allow for stock to be penned and settled before judging from 9:00am.
6. Entrants must notify the Head Steward and present forms before unloading stock.
7. The Head Steward may deny unloading to any livestock not suitable for competition (e.g. evidence of infection/disease), in which case the stock must be immediately removed from the grounds.
8. All stock are presented and transported at the risk of the owner.
9. Horned, tagged, branded, or shorn livestock must be fully healed and of good health.
10. Any livestock registered with a breed society are ineligible to compete.
11. No person shall be allowed in the vicinity of the judge during judging times.
12. Judges may withhold any awards or prizes should they think it expedient.
13. The decision of the judges is final.
14. The committee reserves the right to adjudicate on any point or regulation which may be under dispute. The committee decision is final.
